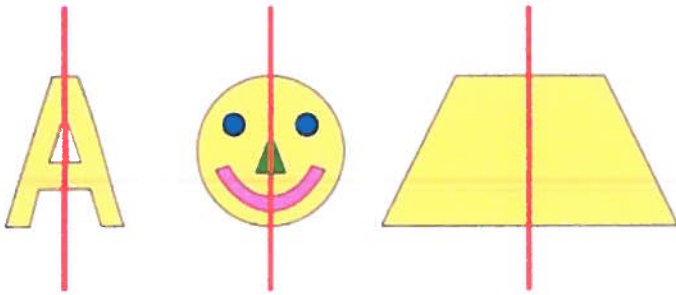

Broken Line



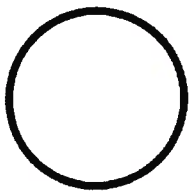
Building: a structure where we live, work, meet, or play (talk about architecture.)

Carving: is the act of using tools to shape something from a material by scraping away portions of that material.



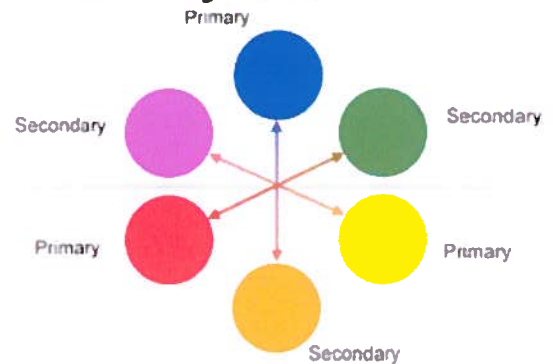
(carving done on a foam paper plate using a pencil)

Circle

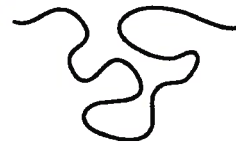


Collage: Objects glued onto paper

Emphasis



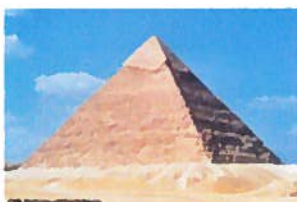
Form: a three-dimensional figure

Free-Form Form



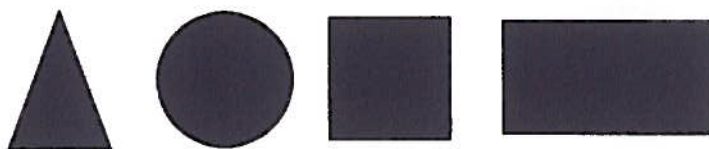

Landscape: A picture of the outdoors

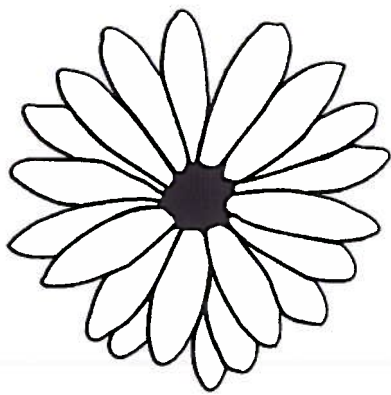
